2024 PROGRAMMING ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Ranked #1 in our First Tee Peer Group Compared Against 12 Other Similar Chapters

- An 14.7% increase of Life Skills Experience Participants for 2024
 - 0 2024: 562

- Percentage of Female Participants for the Year: 47.5% increase of 2.5% points versus last year)

NATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES FOR OUR PARTICIPANTS

Nick Yagnik, a standout from First Tee – Greater Trenton, in September highlighted his talent at the PURE Insurance Championship held at Pebble Beach Golf Links. In this prestigious event, he had the unique opportunity to be paired with Stephen Ames, a prominent figure on the PGA TOUR Champions.

This unique event pairs each First Tee participant with a PGA TOUR Champions player and amateurs from the business world. Ranging in ages from 14 to 18, the First Tee players compete for the pro-junior team title. The teens represented 44 First Tee chapters from across the country. Participants were selected by a national panel of judges based on their personal growth and development through First Tee's programs, as well as their playing ability. On average, participants have been involved with First Tee for more than seven years, have a 3.95 GPA and have recorded a 1.5 handicap.

Raymond graduated from our program in 2021 as a senior graduating from West Windsor – Plainsboro North High School and he remembers how First Tee has impacted his life by preparing him for Yale University. Below he shares the following thoughts: "after going through First Tee's golf and life skills curriculum, I have completely transformed into an outgoing, approachable individual, ready to take on any challenge. First Tee – Greater Trenton allowed me to mature through opportunities like the National Life Skills & Leadership Academy and the Northeast Regional Challenge. In college and beyond, I will continue to make an impact in my community and embody the ideals of a global citizen."

<u>Today:</u> Raymond is a senior at Yale University and he has provided us with the following commentary. "Going to Yale has been a life-changing experience. Over the past four years, I have taken advantage of many opportunities to explore my interests and serve my community."

As a member of the Yale Provost's Undergraduate Advisory Committee, I advised the Provost of Yale University on university academic policies and the allocation belonging at Yale. As a Yale President's Public Service Fellow during the summer after my freshman year, I had the opportunity to work in the Department of Economic Development at the City Hall of New Haven. There, I was able to impact the lives of New Haven citizens by:

- 1. Helping execute a distribution strategy for \$125 million in federal American Rescue Plan (ARP) funding during the COVID pandemic.
- 2. Reviewing legal documentation and advancing work on the proposed expansion of the runway at Tweed New Haven Airport.
- 3. Conducting a review on the health of local businesses through the Downtown New Haven survey, in which I went door-to-door and interviewed local business owners.
- 4. Research and update local and national economic indicators to aid in economic recovery efforts during the COVID pandemic.

This summer, I was an intern at JPMorgan Chase in their Investment Banking Division on the Public Finance team. There, I was able to expand my impact by helping execute financings that enabled the construction of crucial facilities like schools, hospitals, bridges, and utilities. I am excited to have the opportunity to pursue a career in finance while making an impact on the lives of people throughout the United States.

How has First Tee helped me?

I have been able to practice The First Tee's Nine Core Values every day at work and in school, in and out of the classroom. I have been able to exercise good judgement about how I use my time wisely, and I have been able to develop confidence in my abilities over time by persevering through academic and life challenges. Over the past four years, I have taken on increasing responsibility as a member of my Residential College and local community. From serving as a member of the Provost's Undergraduate Advisory Committee, to serving as a member of the Executive Committee of Dwight Hall, the oldest student-run service organization in the United States, I have been able to succeed academically and lead a purposeful life on campus because of The First Tee's Nine Core Values
